Good Day! by Maureen Rupe Willow Creek, North Grissom

Florida Today reporter Jim Waymer wrote an article on December 6th, titled, "More than 1,200 homes proposed in West Titusville," which didn't seem it would impact Port St. John until you looked at the map (shown below) and saw it was just north of our community instead of west Titusville. But this isn't new, it was reported back in January/February Happenings 2012, and the more I've searched, the more I'm finding out.

According to an article "from staff note" in the February 18, 2004 North Brevard Beacon,



the article started, "In a marathon session on tral park area for February 10, Titusville City Council approved several agenda items that will change the face of the city, hopefully for the better." It listed one of those developments as Willow Creek. The article Parkway." stated, "Willow Creek is an up-scale development planned for 672 acres west of Grissom Parkway to SR-407, south of Shepard Drive to I-95 and Port St. John. This is a project that's been in the works for several years, and one where the developer has worked closely with city staff to come up with a "developer's agreement," a detailed, multi-phase (7-10 years) plan, spelling out exactly what is to be done on the property, and what improvements the developer is responsible for (like widening Grissom Parkway). Willow Creek, as now envisioned, will consist of 1,277 total homes that the developer agrees to limit to less than two units per acre. There will be a variety of housing, described as cottage homes, executive homes, estate homes, club homes, as well as duplexes and town houses. It was likened to the already existing La Cita development. Plans also include landscaped boulevards, up to 200 acres of undeveloped land or open spaces, a cen-

residents, as well as a commercial area on Grissom

The article stated there were people there from Port St. John ... concerned about



scrub-jay habitat, school funding and traffic on Grissom and on SR-407 at Shepard. I don't remember arguing on this property, but I'm glad someone chose to speak about these concerns.

I found a Titusville Ordinance in December 2005 establishing the Willow Creek Community Development District. The ordinance gave the Willow Creek District the authority to impose special assessments to make improvements.

Willow Creek has completed improvements due to the 1,277 homes, including the widening of Grissom Pkwy. between Kings Highway and Airport Road, the turn signals and turn lanes at Falcon Blvd./Grissom and the Curtis Blvd./Grissom intersections.



I wrote an article in the January 2012 Happenings titled, "Who's Going to Pay Up For Willow Creek Improvements?" where I wrote the following:

Port St. John on Grissom Pkwy., made an agreement in September, 2006 with the county and the City of Titusville to make improvements to Grissom. The two parties, Willow Creek Development, LLC and FM Land Management, LLC, agreed to pay the county \$500,000 in two equal payments as their contribution. The first payment was due in 30 days, which happened, and a second payment was to be made in September, 2007 by a bank of the two parties' choosing. A second agreement in January, 2007 was between the two companies, the county and Harbor City Federal Bank (now PNC Bank). The second agreement stated the bank would pay \$250,000 to the county on Sep 7, 2007 from funds being held in escrow. In October 2007, an amended agreement between Harbor Federal Savings Bank and the two parties (not the county), was delivered to the county stating the bank had received the money and would make the payment on September 8, 2008.

In February, 2012 Happenings, I stated "As part of the Grissom Parkway improvements, the county is adding a through-lane on the Northbound lane at the intersection of Grissom Parkway and Port St. John Parkway just south of Port St. John." Well that didn't happen.

I found a March 20, 2013 Titusville Planning & Zoning Meeting agenda where they recommend approval of the 3-year extension to the Willow Creek Residential Development Agreement. The agreement was detailed stating it was 672.90 acres. A minimum of 30% would remain natural condition, and 10% would be open space including common areas, conservation areas, lakes, stormwater and pervious waterways. Overall density would be 2 units per acre. There would be six villages. Village A, 375 homes 1,300 square foot living area with 2 car garages on 50 or 60-foot lots. Village B, 190 homes, 1,300 square foot living area with 2 car garages on 50 or 60-foot lots. Village C, 40 estate homes, 1,800 square foot living area with 2 car garages on 80 or 90-foot lots. Village D, 375 single family executive homes, 1,600 square foot living area with 2

car garages on 75 or 80-foot lots. Village E, 64 estate homes, 2,200 square foot living area with 2 car garages on 100-foot lots or larger. Village F, 233 single family club homes, 1,350 square foot The Willow Creek subdivision, just north of living area with 2 car garages on 50 or 70-foot wide lots, mixed with 1,300 square foot per unit duplexes, and 1,100 square foot Town Houses.

> The agreement also said any clearing or code violation carries a penalty of \$5,000 per occurrence, and no clearing can occur within a conservation easement.

> I found a Willow Creek Design Plan by Brad Smith Associates, Inc., which stated Brad Smith Associates, Inc. was hired by the developer to provide landscape architectural planning and design services, including park and recreational improvements, streetscapes, community identity, signage theming and lighting design for this 682-acre master planned community. During an early design team meeting with the client, our Sr. Landscape Architect and Operations Manager, Scott Girard, asked the question, "So just what is a Willow Creek?" When no one had a good answer, Scott proceeded to develop the story

line of the "legendary" Willow Creek, whose headwaters emerge from the center of the large roundabout located in the center of the community. The waters flow under the road and emerge to babble along the edge of the entry boulevard, where the engineer had originally placed a storm water management tract. Scott's initial vision has evolved into what is now planned to be a linear park that meanders between the "legendary Willow Creek" and the entrance road. In addition to this signature linear park, the community will have a number of other park and recreational areas to complete the amenities package, including a clubhouse with a Jr. Olympic pool, boardwalks, a lakeside park, playgrounds, tennis courts and many pedestrian pathways.

I found a March 16, 2016 Titusville Planning & Zoning Meeting's agenda requesting a rezone of 24 acres of a 34-acre parcel from Multifamily Medium Density (R-2) zoning district to Single Family High Density (R-1C) zoning district in the Residential Medium Density Future Land Use (FLU) designation. The request is to allow platting of 100 single family home sites for Wil-

low Creek's Phase I of construction. The agenda keeps referring to the expired development plan. It also states, "The area labeled as Village F was proposed with 233+ units. The proposed R-1C zoning allows a maximum of 5.69 units per acre, which will allow up to 136 units. I don't know if this request was approved, but doubt if it was disapproved.

I found the Willow Creek Development District Website, which had agenda and minutes, along with fiscal year budgets. FY2017 adopted budget was \$31,211 with projected expense of \$24,799 and FY2018 of \$30,995, so either the budget doesn't cover construction, or you can

build 100 homes including infrastructure (roads, electric, water, sewer, etc.) with a lot less money than I thought it would cost.

A Therealdeal.com December 9, 2017 article, "Major housing project planned in Titusville as its space industry expands" reports the developer is proposing an amendment to Titusville's Comprehensive Plan to change the development to a planned unit development (PUD). According to the article, "The PUD designation would allow construction of houses, rental housing units, light industrial and neighborhood commercial buildings, and convenience stores."

I guess things got busy, and things got slow at the North Grissom development, except all the improvements that occurred at both the Falcon Blvd./Grissom Pkwy. and the Curtis Blvd./Grissom Pkwy. intersections. Not sure what Grissom Pkwy. is going to look like if 1,277 homes are developed on our doorsteps. If there are just 2 people per home, that is an extra 2,600 people. I am sure there will be many more businesses due to those 1,277 homes. I'm also sure if there are as many Scrub Jays and other endangered species around the property, there must be many of the same on the Willow Creek Development. I also know if they are going to fill 17 acres of wetlands, no matter what anyone says, that water will go somewhere; either on the Willow Creek development, or somewhere close by. There is no

I am concerned of the impacts on Port St. John from a development of this size will have on our way of life, our roads, schools, etc. We are already suffering from building in floodplains and wetlands in Brevard and throughout Florida. We will never win; nature will come back and ruin your life if you don't respect her.

A New Year's 'Resolution' for Area Residents

Happy New Year! I hope you had a safe and happy holiday. Reports are on the rise of burglaries and car thefts.

We must remain vigilant in combatting theft by removing temptation, unless you're trying to lure them by leaving your valued things out in the unprotected areas of your home. All it takes is that ONE TIME and you could potentially be at risk for being a victim. Let's stop being victims of theft, and start being more proactive.

Most thefts occur between the hours of 3:00-5:00 am. Not only the contents in a vehicle are being stolen, but the vehicle as well. Truck tailgates are a hot item on the black market and need to be locked and secured. A local resident's truck tailgate was stolen in broad daylight while eating at a local restaurant with cameras, whose neighboring business also had surveillance.

We were unable to identify the thief and apprehend them yet, due to 'grainy' and poor resolution photos and video. I encourage residents and local businesses to make it a New Year's resolution to invest in a high resolution surveillance system, or invest in a sign and fake cameras to deter potential thieves, and to actively join our local watch program, which usually does not meet in person, and takes minimal effort to join. We utilize the internet DAILY on Facebook, in a few groups we have established, including 'my page,' and report suspicious activity to the Sherriff's North Precinct in PSJ, and Central area for Canaveral Groves and Cocoa.



Be aware that FB groups do not monitor members and, as a safeguard, you should never share your personal information. Some groups are known to protect those within their group, so it's good to be a member of more than one group to ensure you're getting important information. Practice good internet security to get optimum protection. I cannot stress this enough!

Protect yourself, your family and your belongings. Lock it or lose it! If you haven't and you didn't, you were lucky, and taking a gamble. Theft is a crime of opportunity.

Let's lower our high theft rating in our community by being vigilant and simply using common sense.



Out On The Town - Wayback Burgers

This month we travel again to Titusville to WayBack Burgers for this month's restaurant review. Wayback recently opened up their new franchise in the Titus Landing shopping center, facing US1, right next door to Pet Supermarket. They're open daily from 10:30 AM to 9:00 PM, You can dine in or order ahead for takeout by either calling 321-458-5303 or online at waybackburgers.com.

I don't normally do restaurant reviews of fast food joints, but if you read my articles, you know I'm a burger lover. And because one of my favorite burger places (Quam's) is temporally out of business, I thought I'd give Wayback a try.

Even though Wayback may be considered a franchised fast food restaurant, I consider them a step above the popular ones we're used to visiting over the past 40+ years. The place was impeccably clean, as well as the bathrooms, and the staff were very friendly and greeted everyone who walked in with a smile.

Daicreshia, who took my order, took the time to explain to me the menu and how they operated. Unlike most fast food places, after you place your order, you get your drink and they bring your order to the table when it's ready. She even came by my table later on to ask me how everything was.

I ordered the double Wayback classic burger, all the way except for cheese, which came with the usual; lettuce, pickle, onion, tomato, mustard and ketchup. I couldn't decide if I wanted the fries or the sea salt house made chips. When they realized I was in a dilemma over the potato products, they let me try a sample of the chips. I thought the homemade Kettle style chips were excellent, so I ordered a serving of both the fries and the chips (Must be the Irish in me). The fries were the traditional fast food type french fry, cooked to perfection. Neither the fries nor the chips tasted greasy, which tells me they use good quality cooking oil.

You can't get a beer at Wayback, but that's OK. They have Pepsi products, which I prefer over Coke any day. They also have fresh brewed tea or, if you so desire, have them make you a hand dipped milkshake.

If you're really hungry, you can order the triple-triple, which is a hamburger with 9 beef patties. If you desire something other than a burger, Wayback also offers cheesesteak, chicken or fish sandwiches and hotdogs. If you're health conscious, you can get a veggie or turkey burger with a salad.

As I stated earlier. Even though Wayback is a franchise, they're a step above the rest.

MONTHLY TAX UPDATE

So, you want to know what the new tax laws are? Actually, so do I. The new tax law was not signed by the President at the time of writing this article. Additionally, the Senate and the House version had been merged but was pending the final vote. Therefore, I'll not discuss any issues dealing with this until it has been accepted.

However, there are issues I can tell you about and the first one is the maximum amount you may contribute to your 401(k), 403(b), most 457 plans, and the federal government's Thrift Savings Plan is increased from \$18,000 to \$18,500. The catch-up contribution limit for employees aged 50 and over who participate in a 401(k), 403(b), most 457 plans and the federal government's Thrift Savings Plan remains unchanged at \$6,000. The limit on annual contributions to an individual retirement arrangement (IRA) remains unchanged at \$5,500. The IRA additional catch-up contribution limit for individuals aged 50 and over was not subject to an annual cost-of-living adjustment and remains at \$1,000.

The standard deduction is changing under the new law. The personal exemption is probably removed under the new law. The tax brackets are changing under the new law. The penalty for not maintaining minimum essential health coverage is probably going away.

For tax year 2018, the adjusted gross income amount used by joint filers to determine the reduction in the Lifetime Learning Credit is \$114,000, up from \$112,000 for tax year 2017. For tax year 2018, the foreign earned income exclusion is \$104,100, up from \$102,100 for tax year 2017. Estates of decedents who die during 2018 have a basic exclusion amount of

\$5,600,000, up from a total of \$5,490,000 for estates of decedents who died in 2017, and may change under the new tax law. That's the best I can tell you right now.


Next, let's talk about who prepares your taxes. Did you know anyone can be a paid tax return preparer, as long as they have an IRS Preparer Tax Identification Number (PTIN). However, these PTIN preparers have differing levels of skills, education and expertise. Also, they may prepare your tax return, but they can't represent you in audit or any inquiry by IRS, unless they prepared the return. You may pay more for an Enrolled Agent, CPA, or an attorney, but it's worth it in the long run. Their continuing education requirements can be invaluable.

If you want, at irs.gov, there is a "Directory of Federal Tax Return Preparers with Credentials and Select Qualifications" where it can help you find preparers in our area who currently hold professional credentials recognized by the IRS, or who hold an Annual Filing Season Program Record Completion. You can also check the professional organizations many tax preparers belong to. It is in your best interest to learn about your tax preparer's credentials and qualifications before your appointment and make sure you're comfortable to trust them to

prepare your tax return. Remember, you are ultimately responsible for the return, not you're preparer or friend.



PMC's latest Gold Seal of Approval® and Primary Stroke Center designation was awarded by The Joint Commission, which accredits nearly 21,000 healthcare organizations globally.

"The Joint Commission established the Primary Stroke Center program to set a care standard to protect and saves lives," said George Mikitarian, Parrish Medical Center president and CEO. "Meeting that standard takes tremendous commitment, resources, and work, but we have long dedicated ourselves to providing the highest levels of patient safety, clinical quality, and healing patient experiences on behalf of the people and communities we serve.

"This Joint Commission's Gold Seal affirmation of PMC's quality stroke care means that patients and families can have confidence in the objective measurement, accomplishment, and results, of PMC's treatment program," Mikitarian added.

According to The Joint Commission, "The stroke program requirements were developed in collaboration with the American Heart Association/American Stroke Association. Applicants for advanced certification must meet the requirements for Disease-Specific Care Certification plus additional, clinically specific requirements and expectations."

In 2004 PMC became the third Florida medical center – and Brevard's first – to reach Gold Seal certification for stroke care. Every two years since 2004, The Joint Commission has evaluated PMC's stroke care treatment program on national standards and stringent performance measures. The most recent evaluation, in 2017, resulted in the latest certification.

"Reaching Joint Commission Gold Seal designation is one thing; keeping it by meeting the Joint Commission's requirements year-afteryear is another challenge," said Edwin Loftin, PMC vice president of Acute Care Services and chief nursing officer. "Constant focus and improvement is essential because the faster and more effective the treatment, the greater the

"Stroke is a major cause of death and disabil-Comprehensive Stroke Center, Mayo Clinic's Florida campus. "Stroke care has been greatly improved with new drug therapies, including the clot busting agent tPA, administered in appropriate patient populations. About 85 percent of strokes are due to a blood clot blocking a blood vessel to the brain."

PMC is a Mayo Clinic Care Network member and Mayo Clinic is part of the Parrish Healthcare integrated care team. In 2010, PMC became the first hospital in Florida to participate in the Mayo Clinic telestroke program. Via a self-propelled remote presence robot that stands five feet tall, neurologists at Mayo Clinic's Comprehensive Stroke Center in Jacksonville can remotely evaluate acute stroke patients and assist with diagnosis and treatment, despite them being more than 130 miles away.

Quick administration of a drug called tPA to dissolve a stroke-causing blood clot and restore blood flow is part of the Joint Commission's standards followed by PMC, said Gregory P. Cuculino, MD, FACEP, Emergency Department medical director.

"In many cases the drug results in the patient having minimal or no neurological damage from the stroke," said Dr. Cuculino, "It's one aspect of our approach to stroke care, which inwhile always working as a team."

PMC's team approach also includes Brevard's Emergency Medical Services (EMS).

"Partnering with PMC's Emergency Department as part of its stroke team ensures that lifesaving measures are provided to patients at the scene in the first few minutes of a stroke," said Orlando Dominguez, Jr., RMP, assistant chief of Emergency Medical Services Operations, Brevard County Fire Rescue.

PMC's Stroke Program includes:

- A team of neurologists, cardiologists, radiologists, emergency medicine physicians, nurses, nurse practitioners, first-responders (EMS/ paramedics), case management, therapists (occupational, speech, respiratory and physical),

- A stroke unit. Stroke unit nurses (along with ICU and ER nurses) undergo extensive training to become certified in stroke assessment, treatment and rehabilitation. They have annual continuing education requirements.

- PMC's 14-bed Emergency Department, 12bed critical care unit (ICU), and full-service rehabilitation center.

- Advanced diagnostic technology, including telemedicine technology, ultra-speed CT and MRI, which provides doctors with accurate results in minutes.

- Community education programs and screenings for stroke risk factors.

Signs of stroke are sudden:

- 1. Numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body.
- 2. Confusion, trouble speaking or understanding.
 - 3. Trouble seeing in one or both eyes.
- 4. Dizziness, loss of balance or coordination or trouble walking.
 - 5. Severe headache with no known cause.

An individual experiencing any of these signs, or someone observing an individual dealing with one or more of these indicators, should call 911 immediately.

Healing the Family

Each life encounter has a ripple effect. That's because, as it has often been said, no one is an island. We're all interconnected in one way or another. This is as true in our professional healing work as it is in our personal lives. Sometimes it's hard to remember that as we focus our healing care on the person before us. But Mr. and Mrs. Messina remind us of our greater impact on healing families and healing communities as they share their recent experience.

One moment last April, Mr. Messina was manning his post as a school crossing guard; the next, he was found unresponsive by a group of students on their way to school. "The students were so caring and brave," said Mrs. Messina. "They called 911 and stayed with him until help arrived."

Mr. Messina's condition was dire. He had suffered several seizures, a stroke and had a heart condition. "John spent four days in the Intensive Care Unit at Parrish Medical Center," she continued. "The staff members in the ICU were so good to us both; they were so kind and took amazing care of John! They even allowed our church to come in and pray with us."

Complicating matters, Mrs. Messina had just had surgery prior to John falling ill. She was in a wheelchair, unable to drive herself to and from the hospital. With no family in the area, the community pulled together to help her and to make sure she made it to the hospital every day to be with her husband. The school children who had found him that day in April sent 60 getwell cards.

On the fourth day, Mrs. Messina and the ICU care team witnessed something miracu-

lous. John woke up. He was alert and answering questions and was very grateful after hearing of the care and love he received. Mrs. Messina explained that the loving, healing care did not stop there.
