



Monthly Tax Update

This month I want to discuss Internal Revenue Service (IRS) communications. In the past, you have been told time after time the IRS will not call you and this still stands true to a certain extent. I recommend the following actions when IRS contacts you personally, by mail, or telephone.

The IRS initiates most contacts through regular mail delivery by the United States Postal Service (USPS). However, there are special circumstances in which the IRS will call or come to a home or business. Visits are usually conducted when a taxpayer has not responded on an overdue tax bill, to secure a delinquent tax return, there is a delinquent employment tax payment, or during criminal investigations. Upon arrival, you will want to verify they have valid identification cards and inquire as to what their purpose for the visit is. They will explain their requirements and at this point, I would recommend you calling your tax advisor for how to respond to their requirements, immediately.

I would suspect your tax advisor will request you have them contact them directly. This will require you to complete a power of attorney, Form 2848, for your tax advisor, and let your tax advisor handle all future communications

with the representatives. IRS will provide your most of the time, this isn't true. So, evaluate your tax advisor the professional courtesy time to secure the documents or information required and relieve the pressure and stress you'll experience to report them. For single taxpayers, you must file when they arrive.

your return audited. There are a number of red flags that includes, basically, high deductions, improperly claiming dependents, and having foreign accounts. High deductions usually show up on your Schedule C (Sole Proprietorship Business) where there is excessive mileage, not reflecting beginning and ending inventory, office at home deduction on Form 8829, or meals and entertainment expenses are excessive. Actually, entertainment expenses are no longer deductible and will most likely be an audit flag. On Schedule E (Rental Property) where repairs are improperly deducted when depreciation may be in order, or not claiming depreciation on the dwelling, or depreciating land value.

Next, improperly claiming dependents like parents who receive Social Security benefits and you feel they're your dependent, just because they live with you. Well, this isn't the case. You are required to provide more than 50% of the living costs to claim them as a dependent. This means at least \$1 or more than what they receive in Social Security Benefits is paid by you. I find

Last, foreign accounts are now requiring you Form 8938, if the total value of foreign assets is The next thought involves what will help get more than \$50,000 (\$100,000 for joint filers) on the last day of the tax year or more than \$75,000 (\$150,000 for joint filers) at any point during the tax year. You may also be required to file FIN-CEN Form 114. This is information is important for you to take the appropriate action and prevent unnecessary audits or penalties and interest.







Social Security Column

Now that it's tax season, you might be gathering all of your forms and documentation from the previous year. Sometimes getting all that material together — receipts for donations, business expenses, and travel — can be overwhelming. And losing one vital piece can take up time that you might not be able to spare.

The Social Security 1099 (SSA-1099) or Benefit Statement is a tax form Social Security mails each year in January. It shows the total amount of benefits you received from Social Security in the previous year, so you know how much Social Security income to report to the IRS on your tax return. Luckily, Social Security has you covered. If you live in the United States and you need a copy of your SSA-1099 or 1042S tax form, simply go online and get an instant, printable copy of your form with a mySocialSecurity account.

A Social Security1042S (SSA-1042S) is for a noncitizen who lives outside the United States and received or repaid Social Security benefits last year.

If you have a question, want help finding the information you need, or just can't figure out how to do something online, another way to get in touch with us is by calling our toll-free number at 1-800-772-1213. We provide an automated service option to handle some business, but you can also speak to a Social Security representative between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. local time, Monday through Friday. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, call our toll-free TTY number, 1-800-325-0778, between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. local time.

Tax season can be a stressful time for some, but we've tried to make it easier for you. Remember to share this information with friends and family. If you need a copy of your SSA-1099 or 1042S, go online and get a replacement form with a my Social Security account at www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount.
