## Family, A Nation, The World Say Farewell To the Queen

Queen Elizabeth II passed away on Thursday 8 September at Balmoral Castle, Scotland aged 96. The Queen's funeral was held at Westminster Abbey in London on Monday, September 19. The coffin was placed on a gun carriage, which was towed by 142 members of the Royal Navy. The journey through central London was led by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and members of the armed services from the U.K. and Commonwealth countries also took part. The tradition dates back to the funeral of Queen Victoria in 1901.

King Charles III led the procession from nearby Westminster Hall, where the Queen's

coffin had been lying in state for members of the public to pay respects since Wednesday afternoon.

Walking behind the queen's coffin were King Charles and the Queen Consort, then the siblings, Princess Royal Anne, followed by the Duke of York and the Earl of Wessex. William and Kate, the Prince and Princess of Wales came after them with their children, George and Charlotte, and the

Duke and Duchess of Sussex.

During the funeral, the royal family were sat opposite foreign kings and queens including King Willem-Alexander of the Netherlands, Prince Albert of Monaco and King Felipe VI and Queen Letizia of Spain.

Thousands lined the streets of the city ahead of the state funeral, which is the first held in Britain for 57 years.

After the service at Westminster Abbey, crowds saw the coffin being taken to Wellington Arch as part of a ceremonial procession that will feature hundreds of military personnel and the royal family. The coffin continued its last journey from London to

then continued its last journey from London to Windsor, where Her Majesty was laid to rest.

Queen Elizabeth II ruled the United Kingdom for seven decades. She wasn't supposed to have become queen at all.

Her father, King George VI, succeeded her uncle, King Edward VIII, who abdicated in 1936. After the death of her father, 25-year-old Elizabeth was called upon to assume the throne.



gem right here in our back yard the other day. It seems Port Saint John has its very own horse rescue! Who woulda' thunk it! Tucked behind a very normal appearing neighborhood, a few employees and a small army of volunteers feed, water, groom, exercise, pet, talk to, care about and clean up after ageing race horses, mustangs that had been adopted from the wild and not well cared for, several of the prettiest mini horses these old eyes have seen in a long time and quite a few horses being boarded there.

Graciously patient and enormously informative, Katherine took precious moments out of her own family time in mid-day heat to give myself and my intrepid cohort the grand tour. Beginning with the mini horses, including a little lady who reminded me of myself before coffee - not happy, but still loving.

The high level of care shows in their bright eyes and beautiful coats of various markings and colors. They are inquisitive and very friendly, perfect for the children's birthday parties that can be held on the grounds.

Walking through the stall area overseen by I stumbled upon a wonderful little-known perhaps the largest orange tabby cat in the state, Katherine knew each of the beautiful animals by name and gave us a short biography on them. Having grown up with neighbors owning all manner of barnyard denizens, I expected to be engulfed by an equine aroma... didn't happen. The stalls and horses were clean, odor free and free of flies, far from the smelly, mucky, horse fly covered shed that many of us associate with horses. Some horses are individually owned and boarded at the facility for what I understand is a good monthly fee. Many of the owners are previous volunteers who fell in love with their charges.

> All the rescued horses have to go through a re-training period, giving the humans and horses time to learn each other's nuances and temperament. Race horses are excitable and high strung by nature, and this is reinforced by the race training, so it takes time for them to understand they're allowed to calm down and just enjoy life. When they do, they enjoy being ridden and make patient 'assistant teachers' in the English and Western riding lessons offered. I did not sub-





#### **Monthly Tax Update**

I took most of this from the Internal Revenue Service Center Tax Tips. This information is covering the question if your hobby activity is for-profit or a not-for-profit. Some of us, from collecting stamps and woodworking to crafting and quilting, have all kinds of hobbies – and most of these hobbies will never turn a profit. For hobbies that do earn income, you should know you are required to report it on your tax return.

You should also be mindful that your hobby might be a business. You need to determine whether you should classify the activity as a hobby or a business, and this can be confusing. However, the bottom line is when a business operates to make a profit, it requires reporting.

Most of the time your hobbies for sport or recreation are usually not-for-profit. With that, no single consideration is the deciding factor, but you should review all of these when determining whether your activity is a business.

Here are the things you should evaluate to decide whether you have a hobby or a business:

- Is your activity carrying out the activity in a businesslike manner and do you maintain complete and accurate books and records?

- Does your time and effort in the activity show you intend to make it profitable?
- Do you depend on income from the activity for your livelihood?
- Are any losses due to circumstances beyond your control, or are they normal for the startup phase of this type of business?
- operation to improve profitability?
- Do you have the knowledge or have consulted with another professional to attain the knowledge needed to carry out the activity as a successful business?
- Have you been successful in making a profit in similar activities in the past?
- Does the activity make a profit in some years, and how much profit does it make?
- Do you expect your activity to make a future the activity.

As you can see, it really isn't easy to determine whether your activity is for-profit or not-forprofit, and I would recommend you discuss your circumstances with your tax adviser in making your decision.



#### **Side Effects Of The New Bivalent COVID Booster**

As of September 1, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention authorized an updated COVID-19 vaccine with the goal of fending off a surge in cases this fall and winter. Moderna and Pfizer both have new bivalent vaccines that target the original strain of coronavirus and omicron subvariants (including the highly contagious BA.4 and BA.5), which have been rapidly spreading throughout the world for the last few months. At this point, everyone 12 and over is eligible for the updated Pfizer booster, and those 18 and up are eligible for Moderna's updated booster.

As with the last booster shot and the original vaccines, certain side effects are to be expected, and show that the booster is working. Here's what to know about the side effects of these new bivalent vaccines.

The side effects resemble those of the earlier COVID shots. Those include headache, fatigue and soreness or redness at the injection site. The CDC also notes that a fever is a common side effect after booster shots. Chills, muscle pain and joint pain were also reported, according to the Food and Drug Administration. It's important to remember that these side effects are actually a good thing.

You can expect swollen lymph nodes, too but don't delay a mammogram because of it. Swollen lymph nodes, particularly in the armpit of the arm where you got the shot, can be expected, too, according to Medical News Today. This is another side effect that was widely reported after previous COVID vaccinations and boosters. When the vaccine was first available, some people reported that this issue interfered with their mammograms — swollen lymph nodes can resemble a sign of breast cancer on this kind of screening. Official guidance in 2021 said you should wait to schedule a mammogram after getting a COVID vaccine, but now, updated guidance states that "patients should not delay their screening mammogram because they were recently vaccinated," according to a study published in the Radiological Society of North America's journal.

If you have a mammogram scheduled soon after your COVID booster, just let your docaware of any potential issues with imaging. If you experience these symptoms, you can take medicine to help relieve them.

Dr. William Schaffner, a professor of preventive medicine in the department of health policy at Vanderbilt University Medical Center, noted that if you're experiencing any of these unpleasant symptoms, you can take a pain reliever like Tylenol to combat them. Over-the-counter antiinflammatory drugs should make you feel better and allow you to go through your daily activities, he noted. He added that if your pain or discomfort gets bad enough, you should contact your health care provider.

Adverse reactions are very rare and occur in a few cases per million. Plus, most severe reactions happen within 15 minutes of shot administration, which is why you'll be asked to wait for 15 or 30 minutes after your booster so medical staff can monitor you.

someone who has dealt with tiredness, fever or headache after getting vaccinated — or if you're just feeling anxious about the potential side effects — plan to get your shot when you don't have much going on the next day, Schaffner said.

All in all, it's important to get the new COVID booster. The most recent COVID subvariants are more contagious than ever and are only expected to grow more transmissible as the virus continues to mutate.

Dr. Gregory Poland, a professor of medicine and infectious diseases at the Mayo Clinic, said that the goal of a virus is to infect more and more people. So, it will mutate to become more and more contagious — which is what we're seeing with the BA.4 and BA.5 subvariants. The best way to protect yourself from omicron, which is the current dominant strain, and any future subvariants is by getting this updated bivalent boost-
