2021 PSJ Christmas Parade

This letter is to invite your organization to participate in the 32nd Annual Port St. John Christmas Parade. The parade will take place on December 18, 2021, 11 AM, in Port St. John. The parade route will be east along Fay Blvd. from Waterloo Ave. to Carole Ave. We are planning for 70-80 entries this year. Please send your entry in early.

This year's parade theme will be "Christmas Is Caring." Floats and decorations should be planned toward the theme. All entries will be judged and plaques awarded. Categories include Theme, Christmas Spirit, Creativity, Marching Musical and Marching Non-Musical.

Floats should be no more than 17' high to clear power lines, and be 8' wide or less to travel to and from the staging area. They can be wider on the parade route. Marching groups should plan for a 20' wide roadway.

For everyone's safety, CANDY MAY NOT BE THROWN FROM THE FLOATS AND VEHICLES.

There is a \$30 charge for any float or vehicle

which advertises a business. The fee does not go up for a minimum donation of \$75.00. if there are multiple businesses on the same float. Nonprofit community support groups and public schools are \$15, unless they display banners and logos for a business on their float or vehicle(s).

Good Day! by Maureen Rupe Home Businesses

I'm not sure if everyone knows or realizes the implication of Florida House Bill 403. The Florida League of Cities did a lot of negotiations with businesses to come up with a fair and equitable Bill, but then the Bill 403 that was submitted was nothing like what was negotiated, so both the League of Cities and at least 59 more cities including Brevard County cities Satellite Beach, Indian Harbor Beach, Grant-Valkaria, Indialantic and Palm Shores asked the Governor to veto the Bill. However, the Governor did sign the bill. I'm not sure why the rest of Brevard cities were not concerned as there are issues that must be changed for a number of perspectives.

The primary concern is Florida House Bill 403 allows anyone not living under a Homeowner's Association's rules that prevent it to have any business within their home. So you can sell ammunition, have an adult club, hardware store or anything else opened next door in your neighborhood.

As the Indian River Shores Mayor states in their letter begging the Governor to veto: Spe-

cifically, CS/HB 403 strips local governments of the ability to enact common sense home-based business zoning regulations. As written, the Bill dismantles the protection of local zoning laws in preserving the peace and quiet enjoyment of purely residential areas unless there is an existing homeowners association with private restrictions.

It could be knowing there are boxes and boxes of ammunition stored just feet from you home, or delivery trucks at all hours of the night, or people parking on your property because the home next door doesn't have any room to park left. I'm sure there are a load of other issues we don't want to be worried about.

The Florida Realtors Association stated they expected the House Bill to be modified due to finding out the owner of Popping Smoke Ammunition filed paperwork to start up his ammunition-supply company from his two-bedroom home in Lauderdale Lakes. The city started begging the state to make changes. I hope so, as I'm sure there are a lot of concerns within House Bill 403. This bill should be of particular concern for ½ acre properties or smaller.

The Battle over the Time Change

According to a November 10/2021 Politico. com article by Hailey Fuchs titled, "The political war around Daylight Saving Time takes a nasty turn," the article discussed the fight between Jay Pea and Scott Yates on the two sides of either keeping a permanent Daily Saving Time or a permanent Standard Time. According to the article, "Pea, 43, insists that standard time is the preferable option, and Yates, 56, argues that evidence points to permanent Daylight Saving Time as the way to go (though, he adds, his movement is simply fighting for a no-change clock system)."

Florida Senator Marco Rubio introduced the Sunshine Protection Act legislation that would make Daylight Saving Time permanent (except in those states or territories that don't participate in daylight saving time). The article points out that, "Beyond Rubio, the legislation's 14 co-sponsors in the Senate span the partisan spectrum: from

progressive Sen. Edward Markey (D-Mass.) to stalwart conservative Sen. Marsha Blackburn (R-Tenn.). Momentum to stop clock changing has also spread nationwide. According to the National Conference of State Legislatures, since 2018, 19 states have enacted legislation or passed a resolution or voter initiative that move to make Daylight Saving Time permanent."

"However, Congress must authorize the measure before the states can proceed. And while there doesn't appear to be any members arguing the other side — that a permanent Standard Time is the way to go — or fighting to maintain the status quo of switching back and forth, there is no indication that action is imminent."

The article mentions David S. Prerau, an expert on Daylight Saving Time, stated, "Both sides

have a point but I think that's why the current compromise is the best system." I don't care if it's the best, I'd rather not change to keep forcing my body to change what it wants to do twice a year.

Charter Review Commission

The Five-Year Review of the Brevard County Charter starts January 6th, 2022. This review is a year-long review of the County Charter for consideration to bring charter amendments before the County Commission. They can either accept the proposals or place them on the ballot for our citizens to give their say on the possible Charter Changes.

I have been on three Charter Review Commissions for District 1 starting in 1997/1998, the second in 2003/2004, and the third and last one was in 2015/2016. The Charter Review Commis-

sion, in my opinion, is a waste of taxpayer money as the Charter review hasn't produced much in the last couple of reviews that could be agreed by enough members on the commission to go to the Brevard County Commission.

Paragraph 7.3.3 of the County Charter states, "7.3.3. Amendment referendum: The Board of County Commissioners will cause any Charter amendment proposed under section 7.3.1 or 7.3.2 to be submitted to the electors for their approval or rejection. Upon receipt of the official certification from the Supervisor of Elections that the initiative requirements have been met, the Board will, within 30 days, establish the referendum date. The proposed amendment will be placed on the ballot at a special election held concurrent

with the next countywide election, or at any earlier special election called for that is that Florida Today has not published anything about the Charter purpose. If the Board refuses to comply with Section 7.3.2 or refuses to place the proposed amendment on the ballot as required by this section of the charter, the Board's action may be construed as interfering with the right of the people to petition and may be considered an act of malfeasance within the meaning of two lawyers at every meeting at a cost of two hundred dollars each, Article IV, Section 7(a) of the State Constitution.

There were 19 proposals on the 2015/2016 charter review and none were approved by the Charter Review Commission to go forward. I submitted one that said, "Clearly state within our county's charter the need to maintain a sustainable environment with clean air and water." I didn't even get a second to get the commission to vote. They didn't feel clean air and water was important the County Charter. enough to put in the charter.

It may be advertising, as there are not many from the public who show up and overseeing the Charter Review Commission. with their public input. I didn't see much in Florida Today about the District boundaries until they had finished, and I hope they advertise more during the Charter Review.

The following is from the October 29th, 2015 meeting: Maureen Rupe – Ms. phone: 321-268-2345. Rupe said she has already had people asking when they could bring their proposals to the Board. She stated that they told her they have looked on the county 321-636-2221. website and couldn't find any information about the Charter Review Commis-

sion. Ms. Rupe added that another thing that seems strange to her Review, unlike in other years. I can only hope Florida does a better job of reporting this Charter Review Commission activities."

I'm also concerned with cost. In earlier Charter Reviews, we had and I just saw they want to have a 3-lawyer team this time, so I have no idea what the final cost of this review will be.





Monthly Tax Update

This month I want to bring your attention to a way for you to protect fraudulent filing of your tax return. The IRS has a procedure enabling you to acquire a Personal Identification Number (PIN). The procedure is simple, and you use it while you file your return so that your identity can be confirmed. The IP PIN is a six-digit number known only to you and IRS. After you apply, the IRS will send you a new IP PIN each year.

From IRS.gov, use the "Get an IP Pin" tool. If you don't have an account on IRS.com, you will need to register first. The IP PIN tool is generally available starting in mid-January through mid-November, so you may want to set a reminder on your calendar.

You can also obtain an IP PIN for your spouse and dependents. In the event you lose it, you will be able to retrieve it by signing back in to the



Trials Show COVID Vaccines Well Worth It for Cancer Patients

If you have cancer and you think coronavirus vaccines may do you little good, don't let your hesitation stop you from getting the shots: A pair of clinical trials finds that patients' immune systems ramped up after vaccination. The findings were presented this week during a virtual meeting of the European Society for Medical Oncology (ESMO Congress 2021).

The first COVID vaccine trials excluded cancer patients. So, it has been an open question whether the shots could protect people undergoing chemotherapy or immunotherapy. But two European trials -- VOICE and CAPTURE -- have now shown that the vaccines do indeed protect patients from COVID infection, said Passaro, a lung cancer expert at the European Institute of ten to live music, take part in drawings, 50/50. Oncology in Milan, Italy.

The VOICE study involved nearly 800 patients in the Netherlands. It included people with and without cancer, as well as folks who were being treated with chemotherapy, immunotherapy or a combination of the two. They received Moderna's two-dose mRNA vaccine.

About a month after their second vaccine dose, researchers found adequate levels of antibodies in 84% of patients on chemo; 93% of those on immunotherapy, and 89% of those who got combo chemo/immunotherapy. The results compare favorably to the high level of antibody response seen in more than 99% of the trial participants who didn't have cancer.

The trial also found that two doses are needed to achieve strong immunity in cancer patients. Only 1 in 3 chemo or chemo/immunotherapy patients achieved a sufficient response after their first shot -- about half as many as in those who were cancer-free.

The CAPTURE trial involved nearly 600 cancer patients in the United Kingdom. They received two doses of either the Pfizer-BioNTech or the AstraZeneca vaccine. About one-third had previously contracted COVID-19, and the vaccine produced higher levels of virus-neutralizing antibodies in those patients.

In another clinical trial among about 230 cancer patients in Israel, fewer than a third developed antibodies after their first dose of the Pfizer vaccine. When they got their second dose, nearly 9

in 10 achieved an adequate immune response.

Findings presented at medical meetings are considered preliminary until published in a peerreviewed journal. 
