AstraZeneca COVID Antibody Cocktail Gets **Emergency Use OK**

The Food and Drug Administration authorized pre-exposure and the only COVID-19 antibody the first injectable monoclonal antibody cocktail delivered as an intramuscular dose. for long-term prevention of COVID-19 among people with weakened immune systems before ered at increased risk of an inadequate response they have been exposed to the coronavirus. The FDA issued an emergency use authorization last month for AstraZeneca's antibody cocktail, Evusheld, for what is known as pre-exposure prophylaxis, or PrEP, against COVID-19.

The FDA granted the designation for Evusheld in adults and adolescents (ages 12 and older) who are immune-compromised due to a medical condition or medications and who may not mount an adequate immune response to a COVID-19 vaccination.

The drug combo also helps those who are not recommended for a COVID vaccination.

The authorization does not cover those who have the virus.

Evusheld is a combination of two long-acting monoclonal antibodies and is the only antibody therapy authorized in the US for COVID-19

About 2% of the global population is considto a COVID-19 vaccine. About seven million people in the US are immunocompromised and may benefit from Evusheld. This includes people with blood cancers or other cancers being treated with chemotherapy, and those taking medications after an organ transplant or who are taking immunosuppressive drugs for conditions including multiple sclerosis and rheumatoid arthritis.

First doses are expected soon, according to

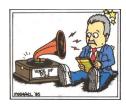
The ongoing Provent Phase III trial showed a 77% reduction at primary analysis, 83% at median six-month analysis, in the risk of developing symptomatic COVID-19 compared to placebo, with protection from the virus continuing for at least six months.

More follow-up will be undertaken for the full duration of protection provided by Evusheld.

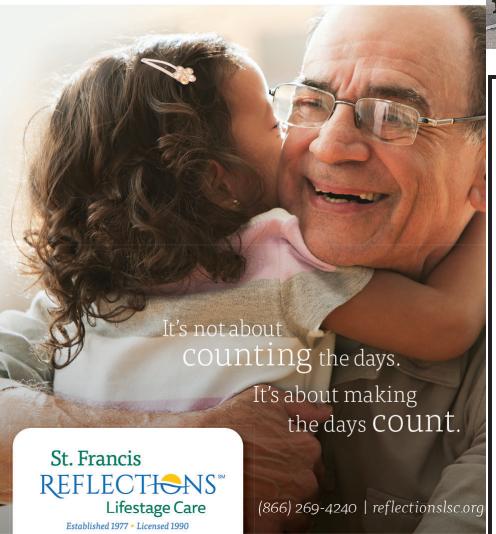

It's Cold & Flu Season

As the temperatures drop this fall, you may have a higher risk of contracting a common cold. That's because common cold viruses tend to live longer in lower temperatures. Plus, when it's chilly outside, it's more likely for people to spend more time in enclosed spaces where infections can spread easily.

Viruses that cause colds can spread from infected people to others through the air and close personal contact. This can happen when you shake hands with someone who has a cold or touch a surface, like a doorknob, that has respiratory viruses on it, then touch your eyes, mouth, or nose.

There is no cure for a cold. To feel better, you should get lots of rest and drink plenty of fluids. Here's a quick guide to understanding and treating a common cold:

Start with prevention.

Avoid getting a cold by washing your hands often with soap and water, avoiding touching your face and steer clear of sick people.

Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer. Viruses that cause colds can live on your hands, and regular handwashing can help protect you from getting sick.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.

Stay away from people who are sick.

Know the symptoms.

Colds usually last for 7 - 10 days. Common symptoms include:

Sore throat Runny nose Coughing Sneezing Headaches Body aches

There's no cure for the common cold, but there









are things you can do to alleviate symptoms, like resting, drinking water and warm liquids. In severe cases, over-the-counter cold and cough medicines may help.

Cold vs. Flu

The flu, which is caused by influenza viruses, also spreads and causes illness around the same time as the common cold. Because these two illnesses have similar symptoms, it can be difficult (or even impossible) to tell the difference between them based on symptoms alone. In general, flu symptoms are worse than the common cold and can include fever or feeling feverish/chills, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle or body aches, headaches and fatigue (tiredness). Flu can also have very serious complications. CDC recommends a yearly flu vaccination as the first and best way to prevent the flu.

Manage your cold. Your doctor can determine if you or your child has a cold or the flu and can recommend treatment to help.

When to See a Doctor

You should call your doctor if you or your child has one or more of these conditions:

Symptoms that last more than 10 days Symptoms that are severe or unusual

If your child is younger than 3 months of age and has a fever or is lethargic

You should also call your doctor right away if you are at high risk for serious flu complications and get flu symptoms such as fever, chills, and muscle or body aches. People at high risk for flu complications include young children (younger than 5 years old), adults 65 years and older, pregnant women and people with certain medical conditions such as asthma, diabetes and heart disease.

Monthly Tax Update

This month you need to be made aware your tax preparation fees will most likely increase, substantially, due to the new passed tax laws.

There have been twelve (12) tax acts since 2015. These tax acts cover COVID-19, health insurance premium tax credits, unemployment compensation, child tax credits, dependent tax credits, retirement distributions, education credits, payroll protection payments, EIDL requirements, and all these have resulted in making the preparation of your taxes more complex than ever. This has also required numerous worksheets being required to establish the correct amount to enter on the Form 1040 or other applicable forms.

Furthermore, one tax act provided relief for all of us, the next tax act changed the relief provided in the first tax act, and another tax act changed both of them. Now, we are waiting to see what Congress will change with the next tax act.

Regretfully, tax preparation was to be simplified. Actually, with the impacts from COVID-19, this results in your need for professional tax preparation assistance a necessity and you should realize and understand the value your tax advisor is worth. A simple misunderstanding of these acts can result in a substantial tax liability or missed additional refund.

Next, I want to remind you to request the assistance of a qualified tax advisor. Be sure to ask about their credentials, maybe ask a friend to refer someone. Are they available year-round, are they able to represent you should a concern develop, and do they take continuing education to stay abreast of the changing tax laws as previously discussed. Next, let's discuss the subject of Internal Revenue due diligence requirements. Every entry on Form 1040 is subject to due diligence requirements. Penalties range from \$564 to thousands of dollars. For example, as a tax professional, if a return includes child tax credit, dependent tax credit, head of household filing status, education credits or earned income credit, then a Form 8867 is required. Each tax credit is subject to a filing penalty of \$564 if adequate substantiation to claim the credit isn't properly documented. This penalty is assessed on you, the taxpayer, and the tax preparer. So, if you have been paying \$200 or thereabouts to have your taxes prepared, and with the tax professional due diligence requirements, you can understand how important your tax professional is and will result in higher tax preparation fees.

I have been doing taxes for over 40 years and have never seen taxes this complicated, even with the Ronald Reagan tax overhaul back in 1986 or with the Donald Trump tax reform in 2017, or the amount of penalties tax professionals are exposed to.

COVID-19 Monoclonal Treatment Site Opens at Rockledge City Center

A COVID-19 Monoclonal Antibody Treatment site began operations on December 10th at the Rockledge City Center, 920 Barton Blvd., Rockledge. The Rockledge City Center is located at the intersection of Barton and Fiske Boulevards. Monoclonal treatments are available under event tents in the southwest corner of the Rockledge City Center parking lot.

The site replaces a monoclonal treatment and COVID-19 testing site formerly located at Kiwanis Island Park on Merritt Island. It closed operations on December 8th.

Hours of operation for the Rockledge City Center site are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., seven days a week. Testing is not currently available at this site, but plans are to include COVID-19 testing at a later date to be determined.

Monoclonal therapy is for patients diagnosed with COVID-19 or considered high risk if infected and weight at least 88 pounds or more. Appointments for monoclonal therapy can be made at www.patientportalfl.com and walk-ups are still being accepted. Treatments are available at no cost to patients, though insurance information will be requested.

Monoclonal antibodies help the immune system recognize and respond effectively to the virus. According to treatment guidelines, they should be administered as soon as possible after diagnosis.

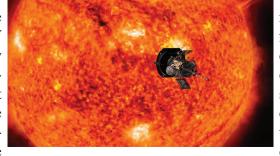

Parker Solar Probe Becomes 1st Spacecraft To 'Touch' The Sun

Three years after NA-SA's Parker Solar Probe launched on a Delta IV rocket from Kennedy Space Center, the spacecraft has become the first to "touch the sun." The Parker Solar Probe has successfully flown through the



sun's corona, or upper atmosphere, to sample switchbacks originate from the solar surface. particles and our star's magnetic fields.

The announcement was made at the 2021 American Geophysical Union Fall Meeting in New Orleans on Tuesday, and research from the solar milestone has been published in the Physical Review Letters.

Scientists, including the spacecraft's namesake astrophysicist Eugene Parker, want to answer fundamental questions about the solar wind that streams out from the sun, flinging energetic particles across the solar system. The sun's corona is much hotter than the actual surface of the star, and the spacecraft could provide insight into why.

The spacecraft has already revealed surprising finds about the sun, including the 2019 discovery of magnetic zig-zag structures in the solar wind called switchbacks. Now, the spacecraft helped sci- Meals: entists determine that these

Every 11 years, the sun completes a solar cycle of calm and stormy activity and begins a new one. It's important to understand the solar cycle because space weather caused by the sun - eruptions like solar flares and coronal mass ejection events - can impact the power grid, satellites, GPS, airlines, rockets and astronauts in

Before Parker Solar Probe's mission is done, it will have made 21 close approaches to the sun over the course of seven years. The probe will orbit within 3.9 million miles of the sun's surface in 2024, closer to the star than Mercury the closest planet to the sun.

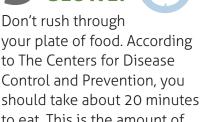
