Parrish Medical Center Board of Directors Vote No Taxes

For the 30th straight year, no taxes will be assessed to support operations of the North Brevard County Hospital District d/b/a Parrish Medical Center (PMC). PMC's Board of Directors voted unanimously during a public hearing on September 23, 2024 to establish the millage rate and budget for fiscal year 2024-2025.

PMC is an independent, public, not-for-profit hospital and state law gives the North Brevard Hospital District (d/b/a Parrish Medical Center) the authority to set a tax rate to support hospital operations. However, unlike most public hospitals, the PMC Board of Directors has for 30 years voted not to use tax dollars as a means of funding the hospital.

"Parrish Medical Center takes pride in being recognized as one of the nation's finest healing environments and is committed to providing exceptional healthcare services without relying on taxpayer funding," said Robert Jordan, PMC Board Chairman. "We are pleased to continue to take this position on behalf of the community we serve while also investing tens of millions of dollars back into North Brevard each year through various philanthropic opportunities. We remain grateful for a community that continues to support Parrish Medical Center. Just as our community supports us, we will continue to support the community and residents we have the honor of caring for," concluded Jordan.

Battling the Myths of Mammography

Myth 1: Insurance won't cover it, or I won't be able to afford the co-pay/deductible.

"Mammography is usually covered under most health plans, including Medicare, once a woman reaches an age determined by the insurer," says Shannon Luker, RN, BSN, Parrish Healthcare Oncology Navigator. If you have Medicare and are age 65 or older, Medicare pays for most of the cost of a screening mammogram every 12 months. Parrish Healthcare offers low cost options for non-insured women during the month of October.

Myth 2: The test is too painful.

Yes, the test can be a bit uncomfortable, but most women don't consider it painful. Compression helps hold the breast still, evens out the breast tissue and allows lower doses of X-ray to be used. If you feel pain, speak up. The technologist may be able to lower the compression and relieve some of the pressure on your breast. And remember that any discomfort is brief; the actual X-ray takes less than a minute.

Myth 3: I just don't have time.

From start to finish, the three-dimensional (3D) mammogram offered at Parrish Healthcare takes 30 to 45 minutes. State of the art technology, such as this, makes it easier for providers to diagnose certain types of breast abnormalities, especially in women with dense breasts. The result? Early detection and better outcomes reduce the number of deaths from breast cancer for women ages 40 to 69, especially those older than 50.

Myth 4: Breast cancer only affects older women.

Breast cancer can occur at any age. Additional factors that may raise your risk include obesity, heavy alcohol consumption and a sedentary lifestyle.

County Commission Approves \$1.23 Million Grant For Amphitheatre at Veterans Memorial Park

Brevard County Commissioners recently approved a \$1.23 million grant for the Amphitheatre at Veterans Memorial Park on Merritt Island. The amphitheatre will be built on the grounds of the Veterans Memorial Park and will include 1,700-square-feet of concession and restroom facilities. The grant will be provided by the 5% tourism tax. When complete, the total cost will be about \$8 million.

The Amphitheatre at Veterans Memorial Park on Merritt Island will feature acoustical engineering with an estimated tiered lawn seating capacity of 2,350 and over 5,000 including adjacent park areas. A scheduled completion date is early-mid 2025. Some of the amenity of the new facility includes:

- Acoustically engineered with an estimated tiered lawn seating capacity of 2,350 and over 5,000 including adjacent park areas
- Amphitheatre performance stage, green room, vendor docking and storage facilities, electrical infrastructure and stage lighting and digital performance level sound production
- Concession facilities and picnic seating, parking, walkways and restrooms

- The park is designed to handle inclement weather through a 24-acre master planned onsite stormwater lake
- Handicapped accessible parking
- Landscaping, irrigation and sight utilities (power, water, sewer, data/communications)

The amphitheatre was conceived through a partnership in the late 2000's when the Brevard County Parks and Recreation Department received an \$800,000 grant from the State of Florida Communities Trust for Veterans Memorial Park Improvements, and the Merritt Island Redevelopment Agency (MIRA) contributed \$400,000 towards the expansion. The 6,000 square foot amphitheatre will include 1,700-square-feet of concession and restroom facilities. Most recently, MIRA was successful in obtaining a \$1.3 million grant from the Brevard County Tourist Development Council, matched by a \$1 million investment from MIRA to complete the amphitheatre project.

According to an economic impact study conducted by MIRA, the new facility is projected to generate more than 11,500 room nights and account for more than \$6.9 million of revenue flowing into Brevard County hotels and restaurants. The park will be operated by Parks and Recreation.

Meanwhile, In Outer Space...

Europa Clipper is scheduled to launch on October 10th on the first mission to conduct a detailed study of Jupiter's moon, Europa. There's scientific evidence that the ingredients for life may exist on Europa right now. Europa Clipper's main science goal is to determine whether there are places below the surface of Europa that could support life.

The mission's three main science objectives are to understand the nature of the ice shell and the ocean beneath it, along with the moon's composition and geology. The mission's detailed exploration of Europa will help scientists better understand the astrobiological potential for habitable worlds beyond our planet.

With its massive solar arrays and radar antennas, Europa Clipper is the largest spacecraft NASA has ever developed for a planetary mission. The spacecraft has large solar arrays to collect enough light for its power needs as it operates in the Jupiter system, which is more than five times as far from the Sun as Earth. The spacecraft will be about 16 feet in height. With its arrays deployed, the spacecraft spans more than 100 feet and has a dry mass (no propellant in the tanks) of 7,145 pounds.

Because Europa is bathed in radiation trapped in Jupiter's magnetic field, Europa Clipper's payload and other electronics will be enclosed in a thick-walled vault. This strategy of armoring up with a radiation vault was developed and successfully used for the first time by NASA's Juno spacecraft. The vault walls – made of titanium and aluminum – will act as a radiation shield against most of the high-energy atomic particles, dramatically slowing down degradation of the spacecraft's electronics.
