Echoes of Old Florida: Highwaymen Paintings on View



Downtown Art Gallery is proud to present "Echoes of Old Florida: Highwaymen Paintings on View," an exclusive exhibit running from Friday, March 14 through Saturday, April 12. This special collection showcases the work of the Florida Highwaymen, a group of African American artists who broke racial and cultural barriers to share their vision of Florida's natural beauty.

Starting in the 1950s, the Highwaymen painted vibrant landscapes of Florida's swamps, rivers and coastlines, selling their artwork door-to-door and from the trunks of their cars along highways like A1A and U.S. 1. With limited access to traditional galleries due to segregation, they built their own market, gaining recognition for their striking, fast-painted scenes. Two key figures, Harold Newton and Alfred Hair, were inspired by Florida artist A.E. Backus, developing a signature style that remains highly sought after today.

Despite early hardships, the Highwaymen's legacy has endured. In 2004, all 26 artists were inducted into the Florida Artists Hall of Fame and their paintings are now highly sought after by collectors and art enthusiasts alike.

The exhibit, "Echoes of Old Florida: Highwaymen Paintings on View" features works from a private collection and will be on display at Downtown Art Gallery, 400 Orange St., Titusville. Please note that these paintings are not for sale. The Gallery is open Monday to Friday, 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Saturday, 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

In years past we have invited the cadets, families and commanders to come to our April meeting so we could present them. However, we have grown larger every year and will present them at their schools this year.



Local Foundation Publishes Children's Cookbook to Fund Education Initiatives

The Foundation for Random Acts of Kindness has released a new children's cookbook, combining culinary creativity with charitable giving to support educational opportunities for local youth. The cookbook, featuring recipes contributed by children from across Brevard County, represents more than just a collection of kid-friendly dishes. Each purchase directly funds the Foundation's Education/ Life Funds program, which establishes \$2,500 education funds for children ages 4-10.

"We wanted to create something meaningful that would showcase children's creativity while also providing sustainable funding for our programs," said Neesha Peters, Foundation President. "The response from the community has been overwhelming."



The cookbook includes everything from simple snacks to surprisingly sophisticated meals, each accompanied by the young chef's story and aspirations. Many recipes feature family traditions passed down through generations, creating a unique cultural tapestry reflecting the diverse community.

In just four years, the Foundation has established

education funds for 77 children across the county. Primarily focusing on student loan debt, financial literacy, and supporting our community. Local businesses have stepped up to support distribution, with Sam's Mart and Tropic Ice Cream currently serves as the primary retail location.

"These cookbooks represent hope," said Sarah McClure, whose daughter contributed her family cookie recipe. "When she sees her recipe in print, she's already thinking about college and her future. That's powerful."

The cookbooks are available for purchase at Sam's Mart and Tropic Ice Cream, and at Foundation events for \$20. The Foundation is planning several book signing events where young contributors will autograph copies and share the stories behind their recipes. A paperback version can also be found on Amazon.

Family Engagement in Early Childhood: Building Partnerships in Child Success.

Family engagement is the key to a positive outcome in a child's development, attitude and behavior. Families are essential to a child's growth, and when families and educators come together, engagement is put to work by building relationships, sharing responsibility, creating a safe environment and working together to choose goals for children. When early childhood professionals and families actively participate, it builds an ongoing process of meaningful relationships.

Some of the top barriers to family engagement are lack of awareness regarding opportunities, time limitations, work conflicts or just lack in a connection with the school.

Let's be honest, the pandemic has impacted each and every one of us in education. The challenge to reverse the negative trends is the importance of knowing the benefits and positive outcome on a child's education with family involvement. So, what can you do to be actively involved? Essentially, creating a partnership between home and school is key. Communication with teachers allows both parents and teachers to be alert and on-board with academic progress. Attending school events and parent conferences will keep you up to date on information. Asking your child questions, setting aside dedicated study time and ensuring support for a home learning environment are other great ways to be actively involved. If possible and time allows, volunteer at your child's school. Study shows children whose families are engaged in their education are more likely to earn higher grades, graduate, develop self-confidence, have better social skills and classroom behavior. It's never too early or late to start building connections. The connection you build today will be the positive outcome of your child's future. The saying, "It takes a village...," requires the support and involvement from all parties involved for children to experience and grow in a safe and healthy environment.
